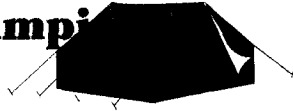


Firesafe Fun in the Great Outdoors

Tent Campi



- ▲ Be sure your tent is flame-resistant. Read the labels before buying a tent.
- ▲ Pitch your tent at least 15 feet away and *upwind* from campfires.
- ▲ Clear a three-foot area around the tent, free of leaves, dry grass, and pine needles.
- ▲ Never use an open flame inside a tent. This includes any type of fuel-burning lantern, candles, stove or grill. Use only battery-operated lights.
- ▲ Keep a fire extinguisher or bucket of water nearby at all times. At night, the extinguisher or water should be *inside* the tent.
- ▲ Have an escape plan. You may need to cut your way out of the tent if a fire should happen.

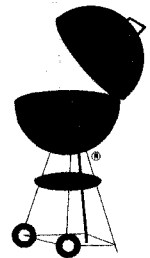
Campfires



- 🔥 Build your campfire away from overhanging branches, dry grass and leaves.
- 🔥 Clear a ten-foot-wide circle around the campfire of any burnable material. This will keep a small campfire from spreading.
- 🔥 Keep the campfire small. Surround it by rocks.
- 🔥 Keep water handy.
- 🔥 Never leave the fire unattended. Drown it with water or cover it with dirt or sand.
- 🔥 Don't allow children to play near the campfire.
- 🔥 Wear snug-fitting clothing when near campfires or grills.
- 🔥 Use dry twigs—not gasoline or a liquid starter—to freshen a campfire.

Outdoor Cooking

- ✗ Never use gasoline to start or freshen a barbecue grill.
- ✗ Charcoal or propane gas barbecue grills should be used *outside* the house, camper or tent. Do not use them on a wood porch or deck.
- ✗ A heated grill should never be left unattended.
- ✗ Children should never play near a heated barbecue grill.



Flammable Liquids



- ☹️ Lanterns and stoves should be filled outdoors, downwind from fireplaces and grills or other open flames.
- ☹️ Never carry flammable liquids in the car trunk or inside a camper or trailer.
- ☹️ Store flammable liquids only in metal safety containers.
- ☹️ Store all flammable liquids at a safe distance from your tent, camper, trailer or any source of heat or open flame.

Camping Trailers

- ☹️ Use only electrical or battery-operated lights in trailers.
- ☹️ Keep a fire extinguisher near the camper/trailer exit door.
- ☹️ Make a fire escape plan. Keep a small ax handy to help in emergency escapes.
- ☹️ Check cooking and heating equipment carefully to be sure it is in safe operating condition.
